DBKL perlu dinamik, produktif urus isu perbandaran - PM

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KUALA LUMPUR: Sebagai pihak berkuasa tempatan yang mentadbir Kuala Lumpur, Dewan Bandaraya Kuala Lumpur (DBKL) perlu dinamik dan produktif dalam mengurus isu perbandaran serta memperkasakan penyampaian perkhidmatan.

Gesan itu dibuat Perdana Menteri, Datuk Seri Ismail Sabri Yaakob kerana beliau berpendangan Kuala Lumpur harus lebih bersih mendepani cabaran dan melihat kepada keperluan masa depan.

Katanya, Keluarga Malaysia mengamalkan prinsip tiada yang dipinggirkan dan prinsip itu terpakai dalam mengurus bandar raya Kuala Lumpur.

"Golongan B40 misalnya, perlu diambil perhatian bagi memastikan keperluan asas mereka terbela. Kewujudan media baru lebih mendekatkan warga kota dengan pentadbiran bandar raya. Ekspektasi warga kota kepada DBKL adalah tinggi. Justeru, keterlibatan warga kota dalam membangunkan Kuala Lumpur adalah penting."

"Ini bagi memastikan suara mereka didengari dan diambil kira dalam segenap perkara. Warga kota merupakan tunjang keutuhan Kuala Lumpur. Suara dan pandangan mereka inilah

yang akan menggerakkan usaha kerajaan khususnya terhadap objektif dalam pentadbiran Kuala Lumpur hari ini. Hal ini selari dengan iltizam saya sebagai Perdana Menteri," katanya.

Sehubungan itu, bersempena ulang tahun ke-50 bandar raya Kuala Lumpur, Ismail Sabri memperkenalkan Paket Kesejahteraan Keluarga Malaysia

Kuala Lumpur (PKKMKL).

"Dalam meningkatkan kualiti kehidupan rakyat, DBKL menyediakan jaluan pejalan kaki, jaluan basikal dan jaringan hijau dengan mengutamakan keselesaan pengguna."

"Bagi menggerakkan aktiviti ekonomi, DBKL menaik taraf gerai perjaya di pusat penjaja yang telah usang termasuk kelompok-

kelompok gerai di tepi jalan yang berlesen," katanya.

Selain itu katanya, DBKL kini dalam usaha menjadikan Kuala Lumpur sebagai bandar raya sifar miskin tegar.

"DBKL akan membina 5,000 'council home' untuk disewa kepada warga kota dengan keluasan minimum 750 kaki persegi, pembakaan lif yang

melibatkan 306 buah lif di 31 lokasi Projek Perumahan Rakyat (PPR) dan Perumahan Awam (PA).

"Bagi menjamin keselamatan warga kota, tahap keselamatan di Kuala Lumpur diperlakukan dengan pemantauan melalui kamera litar tertutup (CCTV) yang dikawal Kuala Lumpur Command & Control Centre," katanya.

Di samping itu katanya, lesen premis perniagaan diluluskan dalam tempoh 24 jam, malah permohonan permit pembinaan bagi pembangunan berskala kecil dan keputusan permohonan boleh diperolehi dalam tempoh tiga hari.

"Sebagai insentif untuk menggalakkan warga kota melakukan urusan secara dalam talian, pembayaran yang melibatkan semua fi permohonan, akan diberikan rebat 10 peratus sepanjang tahun 2022," katanya.

Dalam menangani isu perubahan iklim dunia, Ismail Sabri turut menyokong penuh inisiatif Kuala Lumpur membantu kerajaan mencapai sasaran negara neutral karbon.

"Ini kerana Malaysia disasar menjadi negara neutral karbon seawal-awalnya pada 2050.

"Bagi mencapai hasrat ini, Kuala Lumpur perlu maju ke hadapan seiring dengan bandar raya-bandar raya besar yang lain untuk mencapai matlamat global dalam menangani isu perubahan iklim," katanya.

Covid-19 tak halang Kuala Lumpur kembang pesat

KUALA LUMPUR: Walaupun pandemik Covid-19 melanda negara sejak dua tahun lalu, ia tidak menghalang Kuala Lumpur untuk terus berkembang pesat sebagai bandar terbesar negara apabila penduduknya kini mencecah 8 juta orang.

Perdana Menteri, Datuk Seri Ismail Sabri Yaakob melahirkan rasa bangganya terhadap pembangunan Kuala Lumpur yang genap usia 50 tahun sejak diisytiharkan sebagai bandar raya pertama di Malaysia pada 1972.

Katanya, Kuala Lumpur sebagai ibu negara Malaysia mencapai usia matang dan mengalami evolusi seiring dengan perubahan masa.

"Jika pada era awal

pertumbuhan, Kuala Lumpur dipenuhi rumah-rumah atap nipah, kini ia meriah dengan bangunan pencakar langit serta perkembangan pesat penempatan penduduk.

"Dunia terus mengenali Kuala Lumpur melalui mercu tanda hebat seperti Menara Berkembar Petronas setinggi 88 tingkat yang pernah mencatat sejarah sebagai bangunan tertinggi di dunia," katanya.

Beliau turut berbangga dengan Menara Kuala Lumpur yang merupakan menara tunggal ketujuh tertinggi di dunia.

"Kini, Kuala Lumpur memiliki mercu tanda baharu iaitu Menara Merdeka 118 yang merupakan

menara kedua tertinggi di dunia selepas Burj Khalifa dan tertinggi di Asia Tenggara pada ketinggian 678.9 meter," katanya.

Ismail Sabri berkata, ia jauh beza dengan Kuala Lumpur ketika mula berkembang antara Kuala Sungai Gombak dan Sungai Klang bermula pada 1857.

"Kuala Lumpur kemudiannya berkembang daripada sebuah pekan lombong bijih timah yang kecil dan sunyi kepada sebuah bandar yang dikenali ramai.

"Kepesatan ekonomi di kawasan perlombongan yang menjadi lubuk rezeki telah menarik minat masyarakat sekeliling untuk berhijrah ke sini," katanya.

Thumbs up for govt's 'One Family, One House' aspiration

Malaysians in B40, M40 groups happy that they finally get to own affordable forever homes

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THE National Affordable Housing Council (MP-MNI)'s "One Family, One House" target has given hope to Malaysians to finally secure a forever home at an affordable

price.

Yesterday, Prime Minister Datuk Seri Ismail Sabri Yaakob announced the initiative to ensure that financial institutions facilitated loans for the B40 and M40 groups to buy People's Housing Project (PPR) and affordable houses.

Ismail Sabri said focus would be on those who wanted to make direct purchases and rent-to-own to achieve the "One Family, One House" target.

Welcoming the move is entrepreneur Salthani Ibrahim, 37, who has been renting a house with her family of four in Wangsa Maju here for more than six years.

Salthani said having a forever home for her two children meant that they would be able to grow up comfortably in their own home.

"We have been renting for more than six years and it costs us about RM800 a month. I want to have a house of our own soon as my children are growing up."

"Having our own home means having new memories and a space that we can call ours for years to come," she told the *New Straits Times*.

Salthani hoped the government would fulfil its promise to build the homes on schedule as some government housing projects had been delayed.

"Any affordable housing project by the government is good from the start. But the initiative must be fulfilled from beginning to end."

"For people like us who are renting, we not only need to secure a

loan but also rent a house while waiting for the housing project to be completed."

"In reality, there were some housing projects that took almost a decade to be completed."

"We need the assurance from the government that the project will be completed on time as we could not afford to pay rent and service our loan at the same time."

For housewife Zara Nadia Zainal Abidin, 34, the announcement has given her family a glimmer of hope to purchase their own house.

Zara and her husband have been searching for a house but have yet to find one that can match their household income of around RM1,000 per month.

They have been renting a one-room unit for RM94 a month under the Kuala Lumpur City Hall (DBKL) housing project.

"It is everyone's dream to own a home when they settle down. I am lucky to rent a house in KL."

"My husband, who is a general worker, needs to be located in the city centre as it is closer to his workplace. I am doing an online business to help him."

"Thankfully, I have one child, so space is not an issue now but in the future, of course, we want the family to grow."

"I hope there will be a housing loan that is economically sound for us and that the government will consider people like us, who are trying to make ends meet to finally own a house."

Ismail Sabri, in a statement yesterday, instructed Bank Negara Malaysia to review the housing financing model to facilitate house ownership to ensure that financial institutions will be able to facilitate loans for the B40 and M40 groups to

buy PPR and affordable houses.

Sharing Zara's sentiment is marketing executive Maine Ang, 30, who says one of the main challenges in purchasing a property is securing a bank loan.

"I think the most challenging part in buying a property, besides finding a good location, is budgeting and securing a bank loan."

"It's really hard nowadays to get a loan and as average young adults, like myself, we mostly depend on home loans to buy a house. Also, the most important thing in getting a loan is to maintain a good credit score."

Ang said having the opportunity to purchase her own home would be a sweet success.

"All I can imagine is that when I finally buy my own house and go through the entire process, I will be so happy."

"Having a set of shiny new keys and a place to call home, a place to feel safe and start a family. It will give me peace of mind that I've been longing for."

Operations assistant Anis Shazlin, 24, said the "One Family, One House" project would be beneficial if the properties developed were at a strategic location, good environment and most importantly at an affordable price.

Anis expressed similar reasons and challenges when buying her own house, stating that securing a housing loan was a primary concern.

"I would need to save up a lot to buy my own house. I need a housing loan so that the bank knows that I can borrow the money and also pay it back and have a good credit score record."

"I will be very happy if I have my own house with my name so that I can do whatever I want, like renovating it, unlike now as I am renting."

"Also, my partner and I can finally settle down and have a place to permanently call home."

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VANDALS have targeted a river clean-up site around Mid Valley City in Kuala Lumpur for a third time in the past two months.

This comes about a week after *StarMetro's* article on non-governmental organisation (NGO) Friends of Sungai Klang Mid Valley River Three (FoSK TMR3) carrying out river clean-up activities near there.

This time around, the culprits targeted the volunteers' bee pollination project.

FoSK TMR3 co-founder Syuen Toh said mesh wires put up for a pollinator project to attract bees were stolen.

"We completed building vertical coral vines for a bee corridor, but when we came in earlier in the week, the entire thing was gone," Toh said.

"Also, vandalism around the work site has continued as we have noticed items are missing and the gaping hole in our signboards is getting bigger."

Toh added that they were carrying out environmental projects using funds provided by Global Environmental Centre (GEC).

"But we cannot keep going only to see it stolen or destroyed every time," she said.

Following the latest act of vandalism, three officers from Kuala Lumpur Drainage and Irrigation Department paid a visit to the site on Wednesday.

After inspecting the damage and taking note of Toh's complaints on river pollution and encroachment, the officers promised to bring the matter up with Kuala Lumpur City

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NGO decries targeted vandalism

Signboards damaged, plants destroyed at Sungai Klang riverbank near KL mall

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A NON-governmental organisation says unknown culprits are destroying environmental cleaning sites along the riverbank in a stretch of Sungai Klang near Mid Valley Megamall, Kuala Lumpur.

Friends of Sungai Klang Mid Valley River Three (FoSK TMR3) co-founder Syuen Toh said plastic waste fished out of the river and collected for recycling was burnt.

More than 100kg of materials kept at the riverside nursery were also defaced in the fire.

"This was the second arson incident here. The first occurred in December last year."

The vandals also cut the mesh wire placed along the sides of a pedestrian bridge to stop rubbish from entering the garden below.

"Among the things thrown below included shopping carts."

"Our flower and tree planter boxes planted to attract bees and butterflies were also destroyed, and the signage removed," she said.

The project was the River of Life public outreach programme signboard at the site.

FoSK TMR3 is an award-winning NGO that was co-founded by Toh and Kennedy Michael to transform Sungai Klang into a "river park".

Meanwhile, GEC river care programme manager Dr K. Kalithasan said unlike other public outreach programmes which saw active participation from the surrounding community, the Mid Valley stretch of the river was more challenging.

"This is because the volunteers are members of the public and not the community from the area."

"We are not seeing residents living and working around the Abdullah Hukum apartment and Mid Valley City stakeholders taking ownership of the river."

"We believe that if the community takes ownership of the riverbank area, the vandalism and pollution will stop," he said.

Nowhere to go after 50 years

200 families in Jinjang Selatan Tambahan fear losing relocation opportunity without TOL

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RESIDENTS of Jinjang Selatan Tambahan (JST) in Kuala Lumpur, who were asked to make way for a mixed development project, face losing the relocation package offered to them.


About 200 families, including some who have lived there for 50 years, do not possess a Temporary Occupation Licence (TOL) and have been classified as squatters.

JST Residents Association secretary K. Selvakumar said they were given notice in November to verify their TOL at the developer's office by Jan 31 or risk being classified as squatters and barred from receiving any relocation package from Kuala Lumpur City Hall (DBKL).

He said this requirement was not imposed on the 137 families whose homes were demolished earlier in 2017.

"Those families have already signed contracts and will be able to get new homes.

"However, the notice stated that those who are unable to verify their TOL will not be eligible," he said during a press conference called by a group of residents at JST.

brought supporting documentation to the developer for verification but they were rejected.

"There are also those who bought the property from others and could not produce the document. "We want to solve this issue amicably and hope the mayor, Federal Territories minister, DBKL and developer will sit down with us to find a fair and just solution," he said.

Bringing fresh produce, unique snacks together

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THERE were durians from Pahang and a fried chicken chain from Kelantan.

Buskers and lively banter from two emcees entertained visitors while they were deciding on favourites such as *keropok lekor*, fruit rojak and roasted peanuts.

There were also a chilli fishing competition, *ulum*-eating campaign and lucky draw.

Held in conjunction with Federal Territory Day celebrations, the food truck carnival and agro bazaar at Precinct 2 in Putrajaya saw the participation of some 120 traders who came from as far as Perak, Pahang and Johor.

Roasted banana crisps and peanuts trader Sharifah Abdul Karem said the event had been a good networking opportunity for her as she got to make friends with a fruit rojak seller from Pahang and a *puttu piring* maker from Sungai Siput, Perak.

"This is my first big event since the Covid-19 pandemic."

"I was down for two years not only in the business sense but also health-wise as I was hospitalised for 18 days after contracting Covid-19 in July last year," said Sharifah. The crisps trader, who paid RM100 to rent a lot for the three-day open-air event, was able to

make RM500 in sales within the first two days, operating from 10am to midnight.

For Che Mazura Mohamad from Pahang, who sold fruit rojak and catfish in fermented durian gravy, the event was one way for the family business to recoup their financial losses.

Menerusi inisiatif menggunakan konsep sistem barter itu, enduduk Projek Perumahan Akyat (PPR) yang membawa barang kitar semula ke kios 1C1R kan mendapat mata ganjaran atau 'green coin' yang boleh dimulung dari semasa ke semasa un kemudian ditukar kepada pembayaran sewa rumah serta urang keperluan harian.

Misalnya, setiap satu kilogram (kg) sisa tin aluminium yang mewakili 12 mata ganjaran boleh ditukar dengan sepeti gula, manakala setiap satu logram minyak masak terpapit akan ditukar kepada mata ganjaran bernilai sekitar RM2, ang jika dikumpul sehingga 240 mata ganjaran (50kg) boleh tukarkan kepada sewa bulanan bernilai RM124.
