

'Display contact details at public facilities'

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This will make it easier to report emergencies, say stakeholders

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DISPLAY of contact numbers on public facilities such as pedestrian bridges, escalators and bus stands should be mandatory.

In addition to emergencies, it will make it easier for people to give feedback and lodge complaints about faulty structures.

The issue surfaced after an incident on Monday when an escalator caught fire in Jalan Ampang, Kuala Lumpur.

Many thought the escalator belonged to Rapid Rail Sdn Bhd as the bridge was linked to the Ampang Park LRT station.

"I use the bridge and escalator all the time and was shocked when I saw the fire," said Amirul Helmi, a dispatch rider.

"I called the LRT company many times to find out when the bridge would be repaired but could not get through," he said, adding that the number should have been displayed clearly.

Salesman Sam Wong said the authorities should list the telephone numbers at the site like what DBKL does with traffic lights.

"At least we know who to notify if the lights at the bridge are not working," said Wong.

A Rapid Rail spokesperson confirmed that the bridge and escalator did not belong to the company.

"Putting the name and number of the company in charge at the site will probably put an end to all confusion," he agreed.

He added that many stations were connected to bridges and escalators that did not belong to Rapid Rail.

When contacted, Kuala Lumpur City Hall (DBKL) Road Transport Department director Yu Chuan Hock said that while the bridge was owned by DBKL, there was an agreement with the developer for the maintenance and management of the bridge.

"While we are the owner, the developer is to maintain and manage the bridge and related facilities," Yu said via WhatsApp.

Meanwhile, the Intermark Mall Kuala Lumpur management said in a statement that it regretted the inconvenience caused due to the partial closure of the bridge until further notice.

According to the statement, the authorities are currently investigating the cause of the fire and pedestrians are advised to exercise caution when crossing Jalan Ampang to get to the LRT station.

"We will work closely with the asset owner, DBKL, and the other authorities.

"The Occupational Safety and

Health Department together with the escalator vendor have conducted a site inspection to assess the damage and ensure the escalator removal and replacement are done in accordance with safety and operational protocols."

The statement added that it would provide regular updates on the link bridge access and expected completion date of the replacement.

The bridge across the busy intersection of Jalan Tun Razak and Jalan Ampang was constructed in 2013 at a cost of RM15mil.

313 tanah runtuh sepanjang MTL

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Sebanyak 313 kejadian tanah runtuh dilaporkan berlaku di seluruh negara sepanjang Monsun Timur Laut (MTL) sehingga Selasa lalu.

Menurut Jabatan Mineral dan Geosains (JMG), Kuala Lumpur merekodkan kejadian tanah runtuh tertinggi dengan 115 kes dilaporkan.

Katanya, ia diikuti Selangor dengan 70 kes, Pahang (43 kes), Negeri Sembilan (28 kes), Sabah (23 kes), Sarawak (16 kes), Terengganu (13 kes) manakala masing-masing satu kes bagi Melaka, Johor dan Perak.

perangkap,” katanya. Laporan itu memaklumkan tindakan awal sudah diambil di kawasan yang terjejas antaranya memasang kanvas dan penghadang bagi mengurangkan kes runtuh.

Selain itu, pemilik tanah persendirian juga diminta mengosongkan tapak dan rumah yang terjejas.

Katanya, bagi runtuh berhampiran kawasan perumahan, penduduk diarahkan berpindah buat sementara waktu bagi membolehkan kerja pembaikan dijalankan seperti di Batu Caves dan Shah Alam.

Menurutnya, JMG juga sentiasa memberikan nasihat teknikal bagi mengurangkan risiko runtuh susulan.

"Sebelum ini hanya berlaku banjir kilat sahaja, kini tanah runtuh pula. Saya risau ia (tanah runtuh) akan berulang dan minta pihak berwajib melihat situasi ini."

"Saya difahamkan kawasan Bukit Dinding di belakang kediaman ini sedang berlaku pembangunan. Saya mohon ada pemantauan

berhubung perkara itu," katanya ditemui, semalam.

Menurutnya, penduduk kini sedang membersihkan lumpur tebal kira-kira 0.5 meter akibat tanah runtuh itu.

"Nasib ada ji-

ran-jiran yang datang membantu membersihkan, mungkin ambil sedikit masa untuk dibersihkan (lumpur).

"Apa yang merisaukan jika hujan lebat berlaku, kita tidak tahu apa akan jadi kepada bukit ini nanti," katanya.
