DBKL tutup pusat hiburan ingkar

Kuala Lumpur: Dua pusat hiburan di sekitar Jalan Telawi di sini, diarah tutup semula oleh Dewan Bandaraya Kuala Lumpur (DBKL) selepas beroperasi melanggar syarat lesen.

Dalam satu kenyataan, DBKL berkata, tindakan khas dan susulan itu diambil pada Jumaat lalu dan 10 April mengikut Seksyen 17, Akta Hiburan 1992.

Katanya, laporan polis dibuat terhadap kedua-dua premis berkenaan kerana ingkar terhadap arahan penutupan.

"Manakala sebuah premis dikenakan tindakan penutupan serta merta di bawah Seksyen 17, Akta Hiburan 1992 termasuk membuka satu kertas siasatan di bawah Seksyen 4(1)(a) dan 4(1)(b) akta yang sama kerana mengadakan aktiviti hiburan tanpa kebenaran.

"Tindakan sita tiga peralatan berkaitan aktiviti hi-

buran turut dilakukan terhadap premis membabitkan pembesar suara, pengadun bunyi atau audio dan alat kawalan konsol Disk Jockey," katanya.

Menurut kenyataan itu, semua peralatan berkaitan aktiviti hiburan yang disita akan dihantar ke Stor Sitaan DBKL di Jalan Lombong Taman Miha-

rja, Cheras bagi tujuan rekod dan penyimpanan sementara.

Katanya, pemantauan dan tindakan penguatkuasaan seumpama

ini akan diteruskan dari semasa ke semasa.

"Orang awam dimohon untuk memberikan kerjasama atau sebarang maklumat mengenai aktiviti ini kepada DBKL menerusi Sistem Pengaduan Awam Kuala Lumpur (ADU@KL) di pautan pantas <https://adukl.dbkl.gov.my>," katanya.

Gerai mi viral dihentikan operasi

Putrajaya: Gerai mi viral di Bazar Ramadan Putrajaya Presint 3 di sini, dihentikan operasi selepas didapati tidak menjaga kebersihan makanan.

Timbalan Menteri Wilayah Persekutuan (KWP), Datuk Seri Jalaluddin Alias berkata, notis pemberhentian operasi itu dikeluarkan Perbadanan Putrajaya (PPj), manakala Pusat Kesihatan Daerah (PKD) Putrajaya turut mengeluarkan notis amaran kebersihan.

Selain itu, katanya, 15 pengusaha gerai lain di bazar berkenaan dikenakan notis amaran kebersihan premis.

"Setakat ini hanya satu notis pemberhentian operasi dikeluarkan di Putrajaya dan bagi Kuala Lumpur dan Labuan masih tidak menerima laporan.

"Bagi Kuala Lumpur dan Labuan Kementerian ha-nya menerima aduan berkenaan kesesakan lalu

lintas di kawasan bazar, namun perkara itu diselesaikan.

"KWP melalui pihak berkuasa tempatan (PBT) sentiasa mengadakan pantauan di bazar Ramadan dan mengingatkan peniaga menjaga tahap kualiti makanan demi keselamatan dan kesihatan pelanggan," katanya ketika tinjauan ke bazar Ramadan Presint 3 di sini, kelmarin.

Turut hadir, Naib Presiden Kanan PPj, Datuk Fadlun Mak Ujud.

Katanya, PPj turut menyediakan kaunter khas bagi memudahkan pelanggan membuat aduan berkenaan peniaga selain menyalurkannya secara dalam talian.

PPj terus bekerjasama dengan PKD Putrajaya bagi memastikan pematuhan kriteria keselamatan di kawasan penyediaan dan

penyajian makanan di samping amalan pengendalian makanan sihat.

DBKL: Kepong food truck operators are legal

THE trading spot at Jalan Rimbunan Raya 1 in Kepong, Kuala Lumpur which traders complained was unfairly given to food truck operators, is part of a Wilayah Prihatin programme, says Kuala Lumpur City Hall (DBKL).

In a statement, the local authority said the programme was initiated during the movement control order to alleviate economic hardship faced by petty traders due to the Covid-19 pandemic.

The Wilayah Prihatin programme was aimed at identifying suitable sites for mobile traders operating from food trucks, caravans and tri-cycles as well as canopied stalls as a transformation step for roadside businesses.

DBKL added that the spot for food truck operators was chosen during a meeting involving all petty traders to ensure everyone concerned was made aware of the reorganisation of trading spaces allocated

ed by DBKL under the programme. Other locations involved in this programme were Jalan Dungun, Jalan Gelenggang and Jalan Seri Rampai.

However, a handful of traders did not want to participate in the reorganisation.

They continued operating without licence and created disturbances at the site allocated for the food trucks, added DBKL.

"The meetings were carried out to ensure the economic viability of the area's existing traders would

not be affected.

"Discussions were conducted with the residents representative council and feedback was also obtained from the area MPs.

"During the meetings, it was made clear that this project was to ensure the development of young entrepreneurs in the city and that it would be carried out in a systematic and orderly manner," DBKL said, adding that no objections were raised by those who had attended the meetings.

For the purpose of supervision

and to ensure its operators complied with the terms set by DBKL, the Kuala Lumpur Food Truck Entrepreneurs Association (KLFEA) was appointed to organise and manage the site.

DBKL said its officers conducted periodic checks and found that the issues highlighted by the complainants were not serious.

CCTV footages also showed no serious road congestion, parking problems or hygiene issues.

DBKL issued the statement in response to *The Star* article on the dissatisfaction of Kepong traders in Jalan Rimbunan Raya 1 after they were issued with summonses.

Speaking on their behalf, community activist Yee Poh Peng said they claimed to have been treated unfairly when DBKL asked them to move for occupying parking bays and obstructing sidewalks.

The traders said no action was taken against food trucks who were operating in the same area, monopolising parking bays and blocking the streets.

Move to improve hygiene at Putrajaya Ramadan bazaar

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FIFTEEN Ramadan bazaar traders in Putrajaya have been warned for poor hygiene and cleanliness standards in food preparation this month.

Deputy Federal Territories Minister Datuk Seri Jalaluddin Alias said the Putrajaya Corporation (PJC) was stepping up checks to ensure compliance among hawkers.

"A tent has been set up in the bazaar to receive and investigate any complaints among customers.

"Any trader found not complying with

proper hygiene standards will be ordered to cease operation," he said during a visit to the bazaar on Sunday.

Jalaluddin also said that 80 bins with a 120-litre capacity and 15 bins with a 660-litre capacity were placed at the bazaar.

"A special bin is also provided by PJC for traders to discard any liquid waste generated during their operation.

"This is to ensure that no waste is thrown into drains or surrounding lakes," he said, adding that the site is cleaned thrice a week.

Last week, a stall selling fried noodles went viral on social media after a customer found worms in a dish bought there.

It was subsequently ordered to shut down for two weeks to make way for cleaning works.

A compound was also issued against one worker at the stall for not taking his typhoid shot.

Jalaluddin noted that the authorities were on a constant lookout for complaints on cleanliness at bazaars.

"Both local authorities in Putrajaya and Kuala Lumpur will act swiftly if there are concerns among customers," he added.

The minister also noted that a programme to collect and recycle used cooking oil from Ramadan bazaar traders is being carried out.

"So far, 46kg of oil has been collected and sent to a biodiesel factory for reprocessing.

"This initiative is hoped to instil awareness about the health impacts of reusing cooking oil," he added.

During his visit, Jalaluddin also gave out 500 packs of *bubur lambuk* to visitors at the Putrajaya Ramadan bazaar.

This bazaar behind the Masjid Tuanku Mizan Zainal Abidin hosts some 160 stalls this year, operating daily from 3pm to 8pm.

DBKL distributes festive aid to poor in Batu constituency

A TOTAL of 350 hardcore poor and underprivileged residents in the Batu constituency received festive aid from Kuala Lumpur City Hall (DBKL).

The Kuala Lumpur Community Aidilfitri Contribution Ceremony 2022, which was held at Sentul Perdana Community Centre in Bandar Baru Sentul, was aimed at reducing the burden of the poor.

Senior citizens, single mothers, the disabled and residents of people's housing projects (PPR) each received RM150 cash aid as well as essential items.

Kuala Lumpur mayor Datuk Seri Mahadi Che Ngah, in his opening speech, said the event was held annually to extend help to the hardcore poor.

"The hope is that through these contributions, we can help with

their expenses in preparation for Hari Raya Aidilfitri.

"This is in line with the Malaysian Family spirit introduced by Prime Minister Datuk Seri Ismail Sabri Yaakob.

"DBKL also continuously holds skills training programmes for the hardcore poor so that they can be more competitive in securing jobs, eventually increasing their quality of life," Mahadi added.

Meanwhile, Federal Territories Minister Datuk Seri Shahidan Kassim, who was also present, said: "Understanding the hardship of the people, I asked DBKL to increase the number of beneficiaries from 100 to an average of 300.

"This initiative will be conducted in 10 other constituencies in Kuala Lumpur before Hari Raya Aidilfitri," he added.
