Putrajaya: Situasi panik berlaku di beberapa bangunan jabatan kerajaan di pusat pentadbiran di sini, pagi semalam, apabila kakitangan kerajaan berpusu-pusu keluar dari pejabat susulan gegaran akibat gempa bumi yang berlaku di utara Sumatera, Indonesia.

Gegaran gempa bumi itu antaranya dirasai di Kementerian Komunikasi dan Multimedia (KKMM), Kementerian Wilayah Persekutuan (KWP), Kementerian Pembangunan Wanita, Keluarga dan Masyarakat (KPWK), Kementerian Pemasaran Luar Bandar (KPLB) serta Kementerian Perumahan dan Kerajaan Tempatan (KPKT).

Kakitangan KPWK, Siti Azila Wahid, 37, berkata beliau menyedari berlaku gegaran pada jam 9.40 pagi ketika menyelesaikan tugasan di hadapan komputer apabila melihat air dalam gelas berkocak, langsir pejabat bergerak dan

kerusi beralih sendiri.

Katanya, melihat kejadian aneh itu, beliau terus mendapatkan rakan lain di pejabat dan diberitahu gegaran disebabkan gempa bumi yang berlaku di Indonesia.

"Gegaran itu sangat dirasai kerana saya berada di tingkat 38 dan berikutan kejadian itu, pihak pengurusan mengarahkan semua kakitangan turun berkumpul di kawasan lapang berhampiran bangunan pejabat," katanya.

Bagi kakitangan KWP, Mohd Firdaus Karos, 36, beliau menyedari gegaran berlaku pada jam 9.50 pagi apabila dinding pejabat dan meja komputer di tingkat bawah bergegar dalam masa lima saat.

Beliau berkata, selepas lima minit gegaran berlaku sekali lagi dalam beberapa saat dan ia pengalaman pertama dirinya berdepan situasi itu.

Katanya, pihak keselamatan bertindak pantas dengan mem-

bunyikan loceng penggera keselamatan mengarahkan semua kakitangan mengosongkan pejabat dan berkumpul di kawasan lapang.

"Pasukan bomba turut datang memeriksa bangunan dan selepas diberitahu keadaan selamat semua kakitangan kembali ke pejabat pada jam 10.50 pagi," katanya.

Jabatan Meteorologi Malaysia (MET) di laman rasmi Facebooknya berkata, gempa bumi kuat berlaku di Utara Sumatra, Indonesia pada jam 9.39 pagi.

Katanya, gempa bumi berlaku di koordinat 0.2° Utara dan 100.0° Timur Magnitud 6.1, manakala jaraknya 76 kilometer (km) Barat Laut dari Payakumbuh dengan kedalaman 10km.

Tiada ancaman tsunami kepada Malaysia dan gegaran turut dirasai di bahagian Barat Semenanjung membabitkan Selangor, Perak, Negeri Sembilan, Melaka dan Johor.

Malaysians rattled by tremors

Hair-raising few seconds as high-rises shake following Sumatra quake

KUALA LUMPUR: Tremors felt in the Klang Valley and beyond following an earthquake in Sumatra sent thousands scurrying out of buildings onto the streets for safety.

Occupants of high-rises at several locations in Selangor, Kuala Lumpur, Negri Sembilan, Melaka and even up to Taiping and Teluk Intan had to be evacuated after the tremor rattled buildings, including hospitals and government offices, yesterday morning.

In Kajang, a municipal council board meeting was halted.

Surjit Hambly, who lives on the 17th floor of the Desa Kudalari Condominium near KLCC, said she felt tremors around 9.45am.

"I was having breakfast and everything on the table and items hung behind the door began to shake. I heard that only those who

lived in the upper floors felt the vibrations," she added.

"I was going about my daily chores when I felt vibrations in my apartment in the Danau Desa Permai condo," said Francis Tan, a resident.

"It was a little nerve-wracking, but it (only) lasted for a few seconds," he said.

Teh Beng Choon, 64, was in his office in Petaling Jaya when he noticed his computer monitors shaking.

"I felt a strong tremor which lasted for a few seconds. I was stunned," he said.

The Malaysian Meteorological Department said a 6.1-magnitude earthquake had occurred at 9.39am Malaysian time in North Sumatra, Indonesia, leading to tremors which were felt in the western part of the peninsula, especially in Selangor, Perak, Negri Sembilan, Melaka and Johor.

Bernama reported that a total of

34 building emergency calls were received by the Fire and Rescue Department in the Klang Valley.

Among the buildings affected were Menara Glomac, Wisma BSN, Menara AmBank and Pantai Indah Apartment and others in Taman Miharja and Jalan Pantai Dalam here, as well as those in Shah Alam, Cyberjaya, Sepang, Kapar, Banting, Puchong, Kajang, Subang Jaya, and Petaling Jaya in Selangor.

A Kuala Lumpur Fire and Rescue Department spokesman said fire stations around the city had been asked to run inspections at the call locations to monitor and ensure that the buildings were safe and not affected by the tremors.

In PUTRAJAYA, the Federal Territories Ministry staffers had to be evacuated to a parking lot next to the building.

Over at the Kuala Lumpur City Hall (DBKL) headquarters, tremors were felt as well, and a DBKL spokesman said it was deemed not

serious enough to warrant an evacuation.

In KAJANG, the municipal council's monthly full board meeting at Level 7 of Menara MPKJ had to be stopped after the tremors were felt.

The television set and pictures hung on the wall in the meeting room could be seen shaking, MPKJ said.

In SEREMBAN, airline cracks were found at two buildings.

State Fire and Rescue Department assistant director (operations) Zamhuri Zaimnordin said tiny cracks were found on the eighth floor of a private hospital and on the first floor of a government complex in Port Dickson.

He said his department did not receive any reports of injuries.

In MELAKA, the Fire and Rescue Department confirmed receiving several calls on the tremors after they were felt in the Melaka government administration hub at Ayer Keroh, Jasin police headquarters,

Hang Tuah Mall and UTM in the city centre.

A spokesman from the Perak Fire and Rescue Department said they received a call from the Taiping Inland Revenue Board about the tremors.

"There were no damage or victims involved and we will be monitoring the situation closely," he said.

In TELUK INTAN, boutique owner Nur Shahira Shaari, 27, said the tremors were felt at about 9.40am.

"I was wrapping an item to be sent to a customer when I suddenly felt woozy.

"It was very brief and I thought I was having a dizzy spell before everything went back to normal," she said.

Taman Sri Kepong Baru folk worry erosion may bring transmission pole crashing

A LANDSLIP in 1/38C Taman Sri Kepong Baru is causing nearby residents sleepless nights as it is located just metres away from their houses.

During heavy rain on Dec 18, loosened soil slid down the slope.

More than two months later, soil and tree parts are still there although Kuala Lumpur City Hall (DBKL) cleared the debris twice.

A resident, Chong YM, said he heard rumbling sounds at around 11pm on Dec 18.

"The next thing I knew, a tree had fallen down and branches could be seen on our neighbours' cars.

"DBKL came two days later and cleared the debris.

"Our biggest concern is the transmission pole on top of the slope.

"We worry the retaining wall would collapse and the pole will come crashing down," he said.

Chong hoped canvas sheets could be placed at the site to prevent further erosion.

He added that Tenaga Nasional Bhd (TNB) personnel had also inspected the area.

Kepong Community Service Centre head Yee Poh Ping said he was told that TNB was responsible only for a 20m radius around the pole.

"Residents are worried about water seepage and even electrocution," he said.

Yee hoped TNB and DBKL would work together to address the issue.

Perbuatan jiji apabila sayur dan makanan kering dijual sengaja disembunyikan di dalam longkang serta lorong kotor bagi mengelak dirampas pihak berkuasa.

Itu antara taktik peniaga serta penjaja warga asing yang dikesan masih berdegil meneruskan aktiviti sekitar Pasar Borong Kuala Lumpur, Pusat Bandar Utara dan Taman Wilayah.

Difahamkan golongan warga asing ini segera menyembunyikan pelbagai sayur-sayuran, bawang dan buah-buahan ke dalam longkang di belakang bangunan sebaik menyedari operasi dilakukan pihak Dewan Bandaraya Kuala Lumpur (DBKL), semalam.

Bagaimanapun taktik itu tidak berhasil apabila anggota DBKL yang melakukan operasi semalam berjaya mengesan dan menyita barangan jualan milik penjaja haram berkenaan.

Jurucakap DBKL berkata, pihaknya melaksanakan pemantauan dan tindakan penguatkuasaan 24 jam setiap hari terhadap warga asing yang menjalankan aktiviti perniagaan di kawasan itu.

"Pihak DBKL turut mempertingkatkan pemantauan dan tindakan penguatkuasaan di Kompleks Pasar Borong Kuala Lumpur (PBKL) dan sekitar Pusat Bandar Utara di sini yang menjadi tumpuan peniaga asing.

"Dalam operasi semalam, DBKL mengawal pergerakan masuk dan keluar di pintu

utama Kompleks PBKL itu.

"Pemantauan dan pemerhatian mendapati terdapat segelintir warga asing memasuki kawasan Kompleks PBKL, dengan menyelip melalui kenderaan peniaga tempatan yang berurusan di dalam kawasan PBKL.

"DBKL akan mempertingkatkan lagi tindakan pemantauan di laluan pintu masuk dan keluar Kompleks PBKL termasuk 'lorong tikus' yang dikenal pasti menjadi laluan warga asing," katanya.

Menurutnya, tiga tindakan sista dilaksanakan semalam

terhadap warga asing yang menjalankan perniagaan di kawasan PBKL serta dua tindakan sama di sekitar Pusat Bandar Utara mengikut Undang-Undang Kecil Pelesenan Penjaja (WPKL) 2016.

Khamis lalu, DBKL turut mengempur lokasi Pasar Pudu dan Pasar Harien Selayang di sini bagi membenteras aktiviti peniaga warga asing tanpa lesen.

Di Pasar Pudu, tindakan sista serta-merta dilaksanakan oleh petugas DBKL manakala tiga lot gerai dikendalikan warga asing dikesan hasil pemeriksaan di Pasar Harien Selayang.

"Empat notis kompaun kesalahan mengikut seksyen 38(1)(c) UUK Pasar (WPKL) 2016 dikeluarkan. Menjadi kesalahan kepada pemilik gerai berikutan mereka tidak boleh mengambil pekerja warga asing tanpa permit kerja yang sah.

Harian Metro sebelum ini mendedahkan kemunculan semula peniaga warga asing yang aktif menjalankan perniagaan tanpa lesen sah di sekitar Pasar Borong Kuala Lumpur, Pusat Bandar Utara dan Taman Wilayah.

Lelaki hanyut bot habis minyak

Pelabuhan Klang: Seorang ejen kapal dagang warga tempatan dipercayai hanyut selepas bot dinaiki disyaki kehabisan minyak di perairan Pintu Gedung di sini, Khamis lalu.

Pengarah Maritim Negeri Selangor, Kepten Maritim Mohammad Rosli Kassim berkata, mangsa, Md Shamsuddin Mohamed Shari, 46, dipercayai hanyut bersama bot fiber ketika dalam perjalanan dari Pulau Ketam ke kapal dagang Lila Bhavnagar.

"Ketika kejadian, bot yang dinaiki mangsa dalam perjalanan untuk menghantar dokumen serta pasport kru dipercayai kehabisan minyak kira-kira jam 6 petang, Khamis lalu.

"Terdahulu, usaha pencarian cuba dilakukan oleh rakan mangsa namun bot berwarna putih hijau berkenaan tidak ditemui sehingga kini.

"Susulan itu, Agensi Penguatkuasaan Maritim Malaysia (APMM) Selangor mengaktifkan operasi mencari dan menyelamat (Carilamat) mangsa," katanya dalam kenyataan, semalam.

Mohammad Rosli berkata, operasi yang dikordinasikan Maritime Rescue Sub Centre (MRSC) Johor Bahru itu diaktifkan jam 12.30 tengah hari kelmarin dan disambung pada 7 pagi semalam.

Katanya, Kapal Maritim (KM) Baglan Datuk dan bot Penggalang 10 serta bot

RH 10 daripada Pasukan Polis Marin (PPM) diatur gerak dalam operasi itu. "Sektor pencarian operasi Carilamat hari ini merangkumi keluasan kawasan 85 batu nautika persegi dari Pulau Ketam sehingga ke kawasan Pulau Carey.

"Cuaca di lokasi cerah dengan kelajuan angin antara 30 hingga 40 kilometer sejam dan ombak pada ketinggian 1.5 hingga 2.5 meter serta ribut petir di beberapa lokasi.

"Pangkalan Hadapan Carilamat (PHC) juga ditubuhkan di Jeti Pasukan Polis Marin, Pulau Indah. Sehingga kini, APMM masih meneruskan usaha mencari mangsa," katanya.

Beliau berkata, APMM turut meminta orang ramai supaya menyalurkan sebarang maklumat berkaitan jenayah dan kecekapan di laut menerusi Pusat Operasi Maritim Negeri Selangor di talian 03-31760627 dan MERS 999 yang beroperasi 24 jam.

RUMAH 'CINTA' LAMPU DISKO

Premis urutan tradisional tawar khidmat seks di dalam bilik khas dengan bayaran RM200

Mendapat jolokan 'rumah cinta lampu disko' apabila pelanggan yang berkunjung boleh bermaidu kasih di bilik khas disediakan dengan bayaran lebih RM200.

Itu antara kegiatan maksiat ditawarkan sebuah premis urutan tradisional di Kepong di sini, dengan menyediakan wanita warga asing sebagai teman ranjang.

Kegiatan itu bagaimanapun dibongkar apabila sepasukan anggota penguatkuasa Dewan Bandaraya Kuala Lumpur (DBKL) dan anggota polis Ibu Pejabat Polis Daerah (IPD) Sentul menyerberu premis itu semalam.

Jurucakap DBKL berkata, risikan pihaknya mendapati premis rumah urut berkenaan menawarkan khidmat seks membabitkan bayaran ratusan ringgit.

Menurutnya, dalam serbuan jam 9 malam itu, pihak berkuasa menahan semua pekerja seks dan pelanggan yang berada di dalam premis berkenaan.

"Pemeriksaan lanjut turut menemui barang bukti aktiviti maksiat antaranya paket kondom, invoice pelanggan selain kamera litar tertutup (CCTV) bagi memantau kehadiran pihak berkuasa.

"Siasatan mendapati premis itu menyediakan deretan bilik khas yang dilengkapi lampu berwarna warni, katil dan bilik air kecil untuk kemudahan pelanggan ketika melakukan maksiat," katanya.

Menurutnya, pihak DBKL kemudian bertindak memecahkan struktur dinding bilik dan sekatan serta menyita premis itu yang jelas menyalahi Undang-Undang Kecil Pelesenan Tred, Per-

niagaan dan Perindustrian (WPKL) 2016 serta Seksyen 101(1)(v) Akta Kerajaan Tempatan 1976. Sementara itu dalam operasi berasingan, DBKL turut melaksanakan operasi tin-

dakan khas terhadap sebuah premis menjalankan aktiviti pelacuran di Jalan Metro Perdana Timur, Kepong pada 20 Februari lalu. Hasil risikan dijalankan DBKL selama seminggu

mendapati premis berkenaan berselindung sebagai pusat rawatan kecantikan namun menjalankan aktiviti tidak bermoral. "Ketika serbuan dilakukan, premis berkenaan di dapati tidak mempunyai lesen perniagaan pusat kecantikan.

"Tiga wanita tukang urut disyaki pekerja seks warga Vietnam, seorang pelanggan warga Bangladesh dan seorang lelaki warga tempatan berperanan sebagai penjaga premis ditahan.

"Pihak DBKL turut merampas CCTV, kondom, minyak pelincir dan pelbagai peralatan di premis itu. Susulan itu tindakan penguatkuasaan dilakukan dengan

memberikan notis kompaun mengikut UUK 3(1), Undang-Undang Kecil Pelesenan Tred, Perniagaan dan Perindustrian (WPKL) 2016 dan premis itu diarah ditutup serta merta mengikut Seksyen 101(1)(v) Akta Kerajaan Tempatan 1976," katanya.

Menurutnya, pemantauan dan tindakan penguatkuasaan terhadap premis perniagaan tidak berlesen dan menjalankan aktiviti tidak bermoral akan diteruskan dari semasa ke semasa oleh DBKL.

"Warga kota boleh menyalurkan maklumat berkaitan sebarang aduan di <https://adukl.dbkl.gov.my>," katanya.



THREE homeless men who were rescued from the streets and now living in a transit shelter, talk to *StarMetro* about the circumstances that steered them to their current paths.

Over the next three months, we will be following them to learn what their hopes are for the future.

In the first part of this series, the men offer readers a glimpse into their lives.

Finding his purpose

Basking under the rays of the morning sun, Basri Yanna looks at the rows of brinjals and cucumbers before him.

These vegetables are top sellers at the urban farm in Taman Danau Desa, Kuala Lumpur, where he has been volunteering for the past six months.

Though the 45-year-old is proud to have contributed to the multiple harvests at the urban farm, he admits to having a keener interest in arts and craft.

His latest piece is an armchair made entirely of recycled bottles stuffed with fabric and paper scraps.

Basri has also learnt how to fix the hands and movements for wall clocks.

A resident at Anjung Kelana, a transformation centre in Kuala Lumpur that teaches life skills to the homeless, the Negri Sembilan native said these little achievements have given him a renewed sense of purpose.

In contrast to his aimless existence when he was homeless, Basri now has a daily routine.

He begins his day by going to the farm.

In the afternoons, he attends arts and craft classes.

Basri was supposed to leave the centre after three months but he applied for an extension and his request was granted.

In addition to volunteering his time at the urban farm and honing his craft-making skills, he also helps the centre's staff by distributing the daily meals delivered by a caterer.

Basri was picked up during a rescue operation conducted by Kuala Lumpur City Hall (DBKL) at Jalan Tun Sambanthan in Brickfields.

He was homeless, having just been released from Kajang prison where he had served a five-year sentence for a drug-related offence. Basri's parents died when he was four months old.

A family friend initially took care of him before handing him to another family.

Renewed hope, new life direction

Homeless folk at Anjung Kelana transformational centre pick up useful skills, learn to be self-reliant

"When I came of age, I began roaming the streets in Seremban, and eventually got involved with drugs," he recounted.

A former factory worker, Basri was never in one place for long. However, he hopes to find a job with his new-found skills when he re-enters society.

"I am quite good at fashioning things out of recyclable items. I just need the materials. Then I can make something," said Basri.

A blessing in disguise

As the oldest resident at Anjung Kelana, 73-year-old Chandran Ratnam never thought he would spend his senior years alone, loitering the city streets in search of food and shelter.

When the Covid-19 pandemic hit

two years ago, the former lorry driver ran out of money when his employer went bankrupt.

He was evicted from his room in Pudu after failing to pay the RM250 monthly rental.

With no one to turn to, Chandran roamed the streets and relied on food donations from non-governmental organisations.

"It was hell. During the lockdown, many restaurants were closed and I struggled to find a washroom to bathe every day," he said.

Chandran wandered around Jalan Tun HS Lee for a month before he was rescued and brought to Anjung Kelana.

Frightened by unfounded claims of mistreatment, Chandran initially evaded the authorities.

But he now sees his "capture" as

a blessing in disguise.

"The staff are very nice.

"We also get five meals a day.

"The quiet life here offers an opportunity to reflect on our past, present and future," he said.

One recurring thought is the possibility of reuniting with his four sisters whom he believes are currently living in Kelana Jaya, Selangor.

Shame and guilt plus the fact that he lost contact with them have held him back from seeking them out.

Chandran admitted to being a heroin addict in his youth.

"I could not hold down a stable job due to my addiction.

"When the police started cracking down and when I could not get my hands on drugs anymore, I struggled with withdrawal symptoms," he said.

Brisk sales of essential goods in Sibü and Kanowit

RESPONSE to the Malaysian Family Sales Programme (PJKM), which had been extended to Sibü and Kanowit, has been overwhelming.

Under the programme, essential goods are offered at up to 20% cheaper than the market price.

The programme was officially launched by Prime Minister Datuk Seri Ismail Sabri Yaakob last Dec 2.

Domestic Trade and Consumer Affairs Ministry Sibü chief Kelyn Bolhassan in a statement said Sing Kwong Shopping Complex, Jalan Salim, Sibü, held the sale from Feb 12 to 13.

Kelyn said consumer response

at Sing Kwong was very encouraging with the number of visitors estimated at 5,936, generating RM119,228.22 from sales.

"From the feedback received, most people asked for the sales programme to be implemented periodically as the lowered prices helped to defray the costs of basic necessities," he said.

He said a sale was also held at Nam Leong Department Store, Kanowit, on Feb 26 and 27.

"The programme has been implemented at the state level in an effort to help the people reduce their cost of living following the increase in the price of daily necessities," Kelyn added.

Empowering residents to forge better paths

DETERMINED to give the city's homeless a new direction in life, the Federal Territories Ministry officially opened the doors of its transit centres in early 2016.

The objective was to provide those rescued from the streets with support and to meet their basic needs for food and accommodation.

It was hoped that by freeing them from the hardship of living rough, they will eventually be empowered to forge better paths for themselves.

Within six years, the ministry – with assistance from Kuala Lumpur City Hall (DBKL) – has established five centres dedicated to assisting the city's homeless.

The first one, Pusat Transit Kuala Lumpur is in Jalan Pahang.

Another three are halfway homes located in Sentul Perdana, Jinjang Utara and Setiawangsa.

The latest, Anjung Kelana in Taman Danau Desa, opened in March 2021. It is located at the site of a former water theme park.

More than just a transit point for the homeless, Anjung Kelana has been earmarked as a transformational centre.

The rescued, who have had their mental and physical state as well as productive abilities evaluated, are sent here for skills training.

In addition to an urban farm, there are workshops set up for printing, upcycling and crafts. Participation is voluntary.

Currently, the urban farming programme is popular among participants. So, the other skills classes, which are usually held twice a week, have been put on hold until there is demand.

The National Welfare Foundation (YKN) has also given smartphones to residents who expressed interest in learning online businesses like dropshipping.

Those sent here are expected to leave the centre within three months and find employment. They can apply for an extension to DBKL, but applications are considered on a case-by-case basis.

A DBKL spokesperson said the centre used to house some 70 people when it first started. There are currently 19 residents.

Those who have left were either reunited with their families or have found employment. There are also some who were unable to adapt to working life as they had been jobless for too long.

"Ultimately, it will be up to the individual and how much they want to improve," he said.

As of October 2021, Deputy Federal Territories Minister Datuk Seri Jalaluddin Alias revealed that 235 homeless people had been offered jobs, thanks to a collaboration between the ministry, Kuala Lumpur Labour Department and Social Security Organisation.

Among the companies that had offered employment opportunities were Top Glove, Hartalega NGC Sdn Bhd, Lotus's, Adabi Consumer and Harumi Brands, said Jalaluddin.

During the recent December floods, Anjung Kelana residents also volunteered to be part of the clean-up missions in Hulu Langat, Kuala Langat, Dengkil and Banting in Selangor and Karak in Pahang.

"The initial target was to recruit between five and 10 people. We were pleasantly surprised that many expressed interest in participating," he said.

Though it is Chandran's fervent wish to see his sisters again, he is adamant that he would only do so after he has secured a job and is able to support himself.

"I will not go back with my tail between my legs," he insisted. Chandran dreams of making a living as a school van driver.

"For as long as I have my legs and hands, I can work. I pray that God shows me the way," he said.

If his plans do not pan out, he is prepared to spend the rest of his days in an old folks home.

"I am not expecting anything big at my age.

"It is enough that I have good health and happiness," he added.

Good to help others

Having been homeless for the past five years, former lorry driver Hiew Jia Hua, 40, never dreamt that he would be part of a flood relief mission.

But after arriving in Anjung Kelana last November, he found himself signing up as a volunteer for clean-ups at schools, mosques and hospitals that were affected by the floods last December.

"I boarded a chartered bus together with a team of DBKL staff to travel to the affected areas.

"Despite the hard work, I did not feel that I was doing labour.

"Instead, I felt good that I was able to help others," said Hiew.

Admitting that he was unable to hold on to a job in the past because of laziness, Hiew added that he was not the type to take kindly to being bossed around by his employers.

"I was very hot tempered. I was jailed twice – once in 2016 and 2018," he confessed.

After his release from Kajang Prison, Hiew said he decided to lead a life free of stress, worry and commitments.

"Where I lay on the cardboard

was where my home was," he said.

Life on the streets taught him the value of kindness.

"I always slept in open places where passers-by would see me.

"Because I was visible, I'd have people waking me up before dawn to give me packed food like fried noodles," he said.

Money was never an issue for Hiew due to the generous nature of the Malaysian public, he said.

"If I needed money, I'd ask for it, politely. For me, it was an easy way to make a living.

"I am a good judge of character. Out of five strangers, four would respond.

"The way to do it is not to ask for too much, maybe RM5 per request.

"I'd wait at train, bus and LRT stations. One day at Hang Tuah, another day at Pudu, KL Sentral next.

"On a good day, I could make RM500," he said.

At Anjung Kelana, Hiew contin-

ues to enjoy a stress-free life.

"I start my day at the urban farm. After that, it's my own time, either to play chess, table tennis or watch TV.

"As every resident here is given a smartphone, I am spending a lot of time watching YouTube," he said.

Hiew does not have any plans for the future yet.

"I don't want to think too much. I know I am not incapable. In the past, I had risen to the post of assistant manager in a direct-selling company and was earning up to RM15,000 a month. So, I know I can do sales," he said.
