## KL in deep water – yet again

**KUALA LUMPUR:** Several areas in the capital city were submerged yet again after a downpour from 11am to 4pm yesterday, a month after a similar episode that saw many major roads submerged.

Floods were reported in at least six areas, including Jalan Ampang, Jalan Rahmat, Jalan Segambut and Jalan Dutamas 2.

At around noon, the SMART tunnel management announced the closure of the facility to divert water in anticipation of flash floods.

According to authorities, floodwaters in most areas receded about an hour later, after which the tunnel was reopened to motorists.

Videos that went viral showed Sungai Klang swollen and the confluence of the river with Sungai Gombak in the heart of Kuala Lumpur also dangerously high.

The federal capital has been hit by floods about half a dozen times since Dec 18, when major floods saw thousands of cars submerged and people seeking refuge on rooftops.

Kuala Lumpur City Hall (DBKL) attributed the floods yesterday to clogged drains due to construction

and areas being low-lying.

DBKL Socioeconomic Development executive director Datuk Anwar Mohd Zain said immediate cleaning work was being done to ensure proper water flow.

On April 25, heavy rain lasting more than two hours brought traffic to a standstill, and two days later, another round of flash floods hit areas in and around Pudu.

## Blowing hot and wet

Weather not extreme, it's monsoon and La Nina, say experts

**PETALING JAYA:** Malaysia seems to be caught between two extremes, with the sun bearing down and temperatures hitting 35°C on one day, and rain pouring until cities are flooded the next.

The Fire and Rescue Department also seem to be caught between floods and hot places, monitoring flood-prone areas and fire hotspots around the country.

The Malaysian Meteorological Department (MetMalaysia) is also sending out mixed messages.

Earlier this month, its director-general Muhammad Helmi Abdullah announced the start of the south-west monsoon which he said would result in hot weather, with a lack of rain or low rainfall.

Yesterday, however, MetMalaysia released a heavy rain warning in several states which saw flash floods.

Yet, the extreme weather conditions are not "extreme", say climate experts.

It is a normal occurrence due to the south-west monsoon and La Nina, they say.

Muhammad Helmi told *The Star* that Malaysia was also experiencing a "monsoon break".

While the south-west monsoon brings a hot and humid period, he said "a monsoon break" is when changes in wind direction encourage the formation of active clouds".

The storm line phenomenon, which brings heavy rain and strong

winds with lightning in the early morning, can also occur during the south-west monsoon, especially on the west coast of the peninsula and west of Sabah," he said.

He added that Malaysia was also experiencing a weak La Nina phenomenon at the same time that was causing additional rain.

This, he said, was expected to continue until October.

Universiti Malaya climate specialist Prof Datuk Dr Nor Azizan Abu Samah agreed, saying that Malaysia

was receiving "above normal" rain due to La Nina.

"During La Nina, we get 10% to 20% more rain even in a drier period and this is expected to last until October," he said.

He said the current hot weather was, in fact, normal because there were fewer cloud formations causing more sun radiation.

However, he felt Kuala Lumpur was experiencing an urban heat island (UHI) phenomenon that also lead to more thunderstorms.

UHI is when a metropolitan area is significantly warmer than other nearby rural areas because of human activities and development.

On flash floods in the city, he said they occurred due to drainage issues in the states and not because of the weather.

Universiti Sultan Zainal Abidin's Dr Azimah Ismail also emphasised that flash floods are a drainage problem and urged the authorities to be stricter in land development approval to minimise the hazard.

**JOHOR BARU:** Several parts of the city were under water while a major road had to be closed when flash floods hit the state capital after a downpour.

It affected Jalan Tebrau, Jalan Serampang, Jalan Bakar Batu, Jalan Tun Abdul Razak and Jalan Pasir Pelangi, where Istana Pasir Pelang is located.

Jalan Tun Abdul Razak was closed to traffic due to floodwater that started to rise just 10 minutes after the rain began at about 2pm.

A video on the flooded Jalan Tebrau and Jalan Pasir Pelangi has gone viral on social media.

However, the floods quickly subsided after the rain stopped a round 4pm.

Motorcyclist Nik Nazirul Nizamzlan, 28, a sales assistant at a shopping mall along Jalan Tun Abdul Razak, said the water began to rise suddenly after the rain started.

"I was waiting for the rain to stop but it kept getting heavier. Within minutes, the road was flooded and I had to go inside the shopping mall."

"This is the worst flash floods have seen in the city in recent years," he said, adding that the Johor Baru City Council (MJB) must ensure the drainage in the city area was clear.

Flash floods also hit Jalan Kolan Ayer and the Pasir Gudang Highway.

## Trapped between two extremes – fire and floods

**JOHOR BARU:** With heavy rainfall leading to floods or extremely hot conditions causing forest fires – firemen are having their hands full trying to handle two different extremes caused by the changes in weather patterns.

The Fire and Rescue Department is now monitoring dozens of flood-prone areas and forest fire hotspots around the country, especially in Selangor, Pahang, Perak, Penang, Johor, Sabah and Sarawak, said its

director-general Datuk Seri Mohammad Hamdan Wahid.

"All our 12,500 personnel from 327 fire stations nationwide have been put on alert as according to the Meteorology Department, the south-west monsoon is expected to bring about a dry spell until September.

"However, due to climate change, we have been getting reports of flooding in some parts of Selangor as well," he said after presenting certificates to outstanding firemen and volunteer firefighters here yesterday.

Mohammad Hamdan said the

department was monitoring hotspots especially around forests, peat soil areas and landfills.

He added that the department would be using drones to carry out surveillance around hotspots as this would allow it to identify the exact areas which required firefighting and to effectively channel manpower.

He also urged landfill operators to be cautious and ensure fires did not start at their locations as extinguishing fires there was extremely challenging because it would need a lot of manpower and heavy machinery, since such fires could be deep

below the surface.

"We also need to be careful about the toxic gases being emitted at these places, which can be dangerous to the nearby population," he said.

He also said most of the forest fires around the country were mainly "man-made", caused by those clearing land for agriculture activities or hikers and campers.

"People should also refrain from carrying out slash-and-burn activities during the dry spell as it can lead to haze if it gets out of hand," he said.

Asked about a Universiti Utara Malaysia (UUM) student who was

found dead in her hostel room after possibly being electrocuted, Mohammad Hamdan said the department would be carrying out its own investigations.

He advised people to be careful with having too many extension points from one plug point as it could be dangerous.

"People need to check their electrical appliances as some, like water heaters, have a lifespan."

"We have cases where a husband gets electrocuted due to a faulty water heater and the wife coming to save him is also shocked, resulting in both of their deaths," he said.

# KL banjir kilat lagi

**H**ujan lebat sejak jam 10.30 pagi dan berterusan hampir dua jam pada Rabu menyebabkan beberapa laluan di sekitar ibu negara dinaiiki air.

Menerusi Facebook Polis KL maklumkan, setakat jam 12.20 tengah hari, sebanyak sembilan lokasi terjejas iaitu Jalan Sultan Azlan Shah dari arah Jalan Ipoh, Jalan Imbi ke arah Jalan

Sultan Ismail, Jalan Ipoh/Jalan Rahmat, Jalan Sultan Ismail/Ampang dan Jalan Kampar off Jalan Sentul.

Menurut kenyataan itu, lokasi lain turut terjejas ialah Bulatan Dato, Kampung Periuk, Jalan Duta Mas dan Jalan Ampang serta Jalan Dang Wangi.

Ketua Jabatan Siasatan Penguatkuasaan Trafik Kuala Lumpur, Asisten Komisioner Sarifudin Mohd Salleh berkata, pihaknya dan petugas Dewan Bandaraya Kuala Lumpur (DBKL) berjungkuhs-lumus mengawal lalu lintas dan melakukan kerja-kerja mengeluarkan air di beberapa lokasi di sekitar ibu kota.

"Seramai 60 pegawai dan anggota JSPT Kuala Lumpur berada di lokasi dinaiiki air sejak pagi tadi (Rabu)," katanya.

## Pelajar cedera kena renjatan elektrik ketika banjir di Sekinchan

**SEKINCHAN** - Seorang pelajar lelaki cedera apabila terkena renjatan elektrik di Giat Mara Sekinchan di sini selepas institusi kemahiran itu dilanda banjir kilat pada petang Rabu.

Kejadian kira-kira jam 2 petang itu berlaku selepas mangsa berusia 19 tahun memegang sebuah corong peniup di kawasan berkenaan.

Pengarah Jabatan Bomba dan Penyelamat Malaysia (JBPM) Selangor, Norazam Khamis berkata, pihaknya menerima panggilan kecemasan daripada seorang guru pada jam 2.08 petang.

Norazam berkata, pemeriksaan mendapati pelajar berkenaan tidak sedarkan diri akibat terkena renjatan elektrik.

"Mangsa diantar ke Hospital Tanjong Karang untuk menerima rawatan lanjut."

"Kami telah menjalankan pe-

meriksaan menyeluruh dan meminta pihak pengurusan premis menutup semua bekalan elektrik," katanya.

Bagaimanapun, katanya, tiada kemalangan jiwa lain dilaporkan dan keadaan kembali terkawal.

Hujan lebat lebih dua jam menyebabkan beberapa kawasan di Sekinchan dilanda banjir kilat pada Rabu.

Ahli Majlis Daerah Sabak Bernam, Noor Sulisiah Ampira Wani Miswan Alvi berkata, beberapa premis perniagaan di Pekan Sekinchan sudah digenangi air sejak jam 1 petang.

Selain itu menurutnya, beberapa rumah penduduk di sekitar Pekan Sekinchan turut dimasuki air.

"Hujan berterusan menyebabkan beberapa kawasan di Sekinchan mula dilimpahi air, bagaimanapun keadaan terkawal," katanya.

Mengulas lanjut, Noor Sulisiah berkata, kawasan perumahan yang turut terkesan dalam kejadian banjir kilat itu ialah di Taman Sekinchan Jaya dan Taman Indah.

"Air naik terlalu cepat dan sukar dijangka. Ini merupakan kejadian banjir kilat terburuk pernah dialami di sini," jelasnya.

Sementara itu, pemilik akaun Facebook turut memuat naik video dan situasi banjir yang melanda beberapa kawasan di Sekinchan.

Menerusi satu rakaman video memperlihatkan keadaan jalan di kawasan lampu isyarat Pekan Sekinchan yang menyebabkan beberapa kendaraan terpaksa meredah banjir kilat.

Malah, menerusi rakaman itu terdapat sampah turut dihanyutkan banjir.

**Kuala Lumpur:** Anggota polis dari Jabatan Siasatan Pengukusan Trafik (JSPT) Kuala Lumpur dan petugas Dewan Bandaraya Kuala Lumpur (DBKL) bukan sahaja mengawal lalu lintas, malah turut membersihkan longkang tersumbat bagi melancarkan aliran air yang tersumbat di beberapa laluan di bandar raya

ini berikut hujan lebat pagi semalam.

Ketua JSPT Kuala Lumpur, Asisten Komisioner Sarifudin Mohd Salleh, berkata seramai 60 pegawai dan anggota berada di lokasi dinaiki air berikutkan hujan lebat sejak jam 11 pagi hingga 1 tengah hari semalam.

"Di Jalan Ampang berhampiran pusat beli-belah KLCC, hujan lebat menyebabkan banjir kilat selama 30 minit apabila saluran longkang tersumbat.

"Anggota JSPT bersama petugas DBKL di kawasan itu berusaha mencari lubang yang tersekat dengan batu dan objek keras sebelum mengorek, sekali gus membolehkan air keluar dengan lancar," katanya kepada **BH** semalam.

Sarifudin berkata, antara lalu-

an dinaiki air disebabkan saluran air tersumbat adalah di Jalan Ampang dan Jalan Dang Wangi.

"Pegawai dan anggota kita sedaya upaya mengorek lubang yang tersumbat untuk melancarkan laluau air bagi membolehkan setiap laluan berkenaan digunakan kembali seperti biasa.

"Berdasarkan pemantauan, kita mendapati air naik sehingga dua kaki, namun keadaan kini terkawal," katanya.

JSPT juga mengawasi lokasi lain yang turut dinilai air seperti Jalan Dutta Mas 2, Jalan Ipoh, Chow Kit dan lorong Balai Putra menuju ke Jalan Sultan Azlan Shah.

Seumur pegawai dan anggota JSPT sentiasa berada dalam keadaan bersedia dalam menghadapi sebarang kemungkinan, terutama ketika hujan lebat dan waktu puncak.

Sehingga jam 1 tengah hari semalam, keadaan banjir dilaporkan dalam keadaan terkawal.



A passer-by claimed the marking on the bay had faded, making it less visible to motorists.

"It should be repainted and signage put up to inform motorists that it is meant for the disabled," he said.

Nor Syahira Md Zin said she saw a family with someone using a wheelchair having to park elsewhere when visiting the clinic because of the motorists'

Azra Rizal Noor Azman said Kuala Lumpur City Hall officers would patrol the area before the movement control order.

"There are also motorcycles parked on the five-foot-way in

front of childcare centres."

Optometry shop worker Nor Izzati Mohd Nazim said the two-lane road could only accommodate one-way traffic.

"This is because many vehicles park on the road shoulder."

"DBKL personnel sometimes clamp the tyres of cars parked illegally but the problem persists," she said. — BY FARID WAHAB

DBKL dalam kenyataan di Facebook memaklumkan, sepasukan anggota melakukan serbuan di dua premis berkenaan jam 9 malam kelmarin.

"Ketika serbuan pertama di Taman Connaught, terdapat empat pekerja warga Vietnam bersama seorang penjaga tempatan dan tiga pelanggan berada dalam premis.

"Siasatan mendapati premis berkenaan menjalankan aktiviti rumah urut tanpa kebenaran DBKL. Anggota mengeluarkan kompaun mengikut Undang-Undang Kecil (UKK) 3(1) UKK Perlesenan Tred
