KUALA LUMPUR - Bas percuma GoKL akan menyediakan perkhidmatan koc wanita bermula Isnin ini.

Unit Media Dewan Bandaraya Kuala Lumpur (DBKL) dalam satu kenyataan berkata, lima laluan dan penjadualan bas telah dikenal pasti seperti dalam tempoh percubaan.

Menurutnya, papan tanda koc wanita atau *ladies coach* akan diletakkan pada cermin hadapan bas dan skrin layar bagi memudahkan orang awam khususnya golongan berkenaan mengenali pasti kemudahan itu.

“Bas tersebut melibatkan laluan hijau (dari KLCC ke Bukit Bintang), ungu (Pasar Seni ke Bukit Bintang), merah (hab Titiwangsa ke KL Sentral), biru (hab Titiwangsa ke Bukit Bintang) dan merah jambu (hab LRT Universiti ke PPR Seri Pantai),” menurut kenyataan itu pada Sabtu.

Mural draw in Chinatown

Lorong Petaling 2 in KL transformed, thanks to heritage artwork

Lorong Petaling 2 upgrade is changing the look and feel of Chinatown.

The pilot project, which is 60% complete, is aimed at transforming this side lane into a vibrant tourist attraction.

DBKL Project Implementation and Building Maintenance Department assistant director Mohd Shahruul Faisal Ismail told StarMetro that business owners welcomed the new look.

"We collaborated with a local consultant specialising in architecture to engage with the business community here for this project," said Mohd Shahruul, adding that it was in line with the aim of beautifying the city.

On Aug 12 last year, StarMetro in an article titled "Seeing red over repainting notices" reported that business owners were upset about notices to paint the exterior of their buildings, saying it had come at the wrong time as they were still trying to recover from the Covid-19 pandemic.


The Lorong Petaling 2 lane mural depicts a 1930s scene of an old market in Kuala Lumpur, which includes a bullock cart.

The mural continues along the wall with the same scene but from the 1940s to the 1950s and 1960s. The Exchange 106 skyscraper within the TRX financial district provides a stunning backdrop to the mural.

Mohd Shahruul disclosed that once the project was completed, upgrading was planned for Lorong

Sultan, Pasar Karat and Lorong Bandar 13 and Lorong Bandar 11.

"It's going to be a 3km multicultural journey of the city over the past 100 years," he said.

Nanyang Art Supplies shop owner Jeff Lian said the murals presence was good for businesses. "So many people are coming here now. On weekends, the place is packed," he said.

Kerrie Mac, an expatriate from Australia, said she usually brought her friends over and the latest mural added to the charm of Chinatown.

"I have been to Chinatowns all over the world, but Kuala Lumpur's is unique," she said.
