"This programme will see people of all races and religions coming together for a shared purpose, which is to create a liveable, clean, healthy and safe city for all," said

WITH some two million people expected to throng the Sri Subramaniar Swamy Temple in Batu Caves in Gombak, Selangor, over the next few days in conjunction with

Thaipusam, the lucal authorities are ramping up preparations to cater to the crowd. With the easing of Covid-19 rules, a bigger crowd is expected at the temple grounds just as traders, too, will be making a return to the

Selayang Municipal Council (MPS) presi-dent Datuk Mohd Yazid Sairi said emphasis would be placed on waste management and enforcement throughout the festival period.

The council has allocated RM150,000 to manage waste and cleanliness around the temple compound, he disclosed.

"This is twice the amount compared to previous years, as we expect more waste will be generated this time.

We have appointed contractors specifical

ly to handle rubbish collection." he said after chairing the full hoard meeting yesterday. Mohd Yazid said waste collection around the temple would take place from Feb 1 to

14.

"We urge visitors to dispose of their waste responsibly and at designated sites.

"The stalls selling food and drinks are also encouraged to place rubbish bags near their stalls, which they can then tie up to be

picked up later," he added.
Roll-on-roll-off bins will be placed in 10 locations with 240 litre mobile rubbish bins placed in 50 sputs.

In 2019, it was reported that MPS collected 150 connes of waste, which included milk bottles used to fill up milk pots (paal kudam) carried by devotees, plastic packaging and broken coconut shells.

On enforcement, Wohd Yazid said its full force of 160 enforcement personnel would be on duty over five days beginning Feb 3. "Only traders who have been given tempo-

rary licence by MPS will be allowed to operate at specific locations outside the temple compound.

"Only vegetarian food is allowed to be sold and there is a strict 'no alcahol' rule," he said, adding that MPS was working with the police and other agencies to ensure a smooth and safe Thaipusam celebration.

The last time traders were allowed to operate during the festival was in early 2020, just before the start of the pandemic and the subsequent lockdowns.

Thaipusam will be celebrated by Hindus in Malaysia on Feb 5.

Scaled-down Federal Territory Day celebrations this year aim to spark spirit of goodwill and integration

ALTHOUGH the Federal Territories no longer have a ministry, the restructured **Tederal Territories Department remains** committed to ensuring the progress and well-being of its residents.

Its director-general Datuk Rosida Jaafar, in giving the assurance, said as an agency under the Prime Minister's Department, all matters pertaining to Kuala Lumpur. Putrajaya and Labuan would now come directly under the purview of Prime Minister Datuk Scri Anwar Ibrahim.

Rosida, who was secretary-general in the

former Federal Territories ministry, said the department would continue leading the three federal territories towards sustainable physical, economic, social and environmental development.

This would be carried out through inclusive strategic cooperation in ensuring the progress and well-being of the city dwellers,

In conjunction with Federal Territory Day today, the department has outlined its func tions, plans for the month-long celebration as well as its vision for Kuala Lumpur,

as went as its vision for Adaia Lumpur, Putrajaya and Lahuan. Through the department's Strategic Plan 2021 2025, Rosida, in a statement, soid 78 programmes and activities under eight core focal areas had been outlined. The eight areas are cleanliness, public

safety, efficient transport system, sustainable socio-economy, green environment, inclusive community, sustainable land use planning and management as well as governance and organisational capacity.
The department's vision and mission, said

Rosida, was to be progressive and prosper-ous, and they would continue to build upon the work of the ministry.

Policy reviews

Without giving details, Rosida said several legacy policies of the ministry would be reviewed, namely on affordable housing, maintenance fund, redevelopment of Kuala Lumpur, young entrepreneurs initiative, free trade zone and biodegradability pro-

The department, she said, would also priuritise strengthening the social safety net for federal territories' residents.

"Some of the initiatives that we will push for include expanding the five My@Wilayah programmes — MyGrocer/ MyFood/ MyMedic/ MySchoolBus/ MyJob — and Jualan Raigat', while increasing efforts to solve homelessness, eradicate hardcore powerty and provide free public transporta-tion.

"The department will also monitor the Federal Territories Residents Representative Council and State Development Action Council, as well as matters involving sports, land, horder and water source manage ment," she said.

Rosida also listed out other areas under the department's jurisdiction, namely disaster management, which included mobilisa-tion of the state and district disaster committee, chairing the state security committee and facilitating floud and landslide mitiga-

tion plans.
"Other responsibilities are managing the

"We are also in charge of implementing development projects related to River of Life, smart city, safe city, green city, Kampung Baru, Labuan Bridge and Putrajaya rail, among others," she added,

Over and above these duties, the Federal Territories Department will function similar

to a local authority. Rosida said it would look at increasing public and recreational parks, facilitate car-bon-free and climate change initiatives as well as managing solid waste, general clean-ing and urban farming. "We will also work on the preparation of

the drafts for the structure and local plans for Kuala Lumpur, Putrajaya and Labuan," she elaborated
